During the month of March, the Department conducted the following: 7 business licenses, 6 site plan reviews, 20 annual inspections, 20 consultation/site visits, 7 CO inspections and 2 sprinkler system inspections. Our personnel completed over 1,092 hours of in house and off-site training to include the following: Pediatric Emergency Assessment, Recognition and Stabilization (PEARS), Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS), Extrication Equipment Operations Review, Basic Life Support (BLS), High Hazard Pre-Fire Plan (Teachers' Museum), Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS), Aerial Operations, Rapid Dress, Turnout Gear Checks, Familiarization Walk Through of Embassy Suites, Driver Training, Fire Officer I. Several members of the Department continue to provide support to the Georgia Department of Health, by administering COVID-19 vaccinations to hundreds of citizens from all the Metro Atlanta and neighboring cities. A total of 152 hours of assistance over a period of 30 days was provided at the Georgia International Convention Center in College Park. The Assistant Fire Marshal completed the Life Safety Code Course at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center in Forsyth, GA. Chief Bloodworth received delivery of his duty 2021 Ford Explorer. The registration and tag for this vehicle have already been obtained.

Between March 1, 2021 and March 30, 2021 there were (501) calls for service. There were(2) Assaults, (1) Burglary, (4) Robberies, (33) Larcenies, including 17 Entering Autos, 5 Stolen Vehicles and 11 Thefts. The Department recovered (11) Stolen Vehicles. The Department made 23 arrests. Average Response time was 01 min 14 secs.

The Department issued 444 citations to include parking, traffic and general copies.

The E-911 center processed 3,129 calls for service.

The Detective Division reviewed (568) cases, assigned (19) cases for investigation, and closed (10) cases. (6) Cases were closed with arrest warrants and (2) by CID arrest. The Detective Division obtained (9) warrants, responded to (4) crime scenes for investigation.

Code Enforcement: Code Enforcement handled (65) new calls for service. Of these calls, the unit documented (7) animal incidents, (6) parking in grass, (2) tall grass & weeds, (5) permit

issues, (16) outside storage, (5) littering or pollution problems, (5) Yard Debris and (0) property maintenance- exterior. The unit closed (31) cases and issued (1) citations.

Abatements: The current properties that are under abatements are as follow: 3 Woodrow lot (between Wheeler and N. Fulton Avenue) and beginning stages of 465 North Avenue (waiting on legal).
