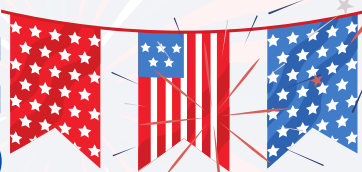

New Arts District Sign Unveiled!

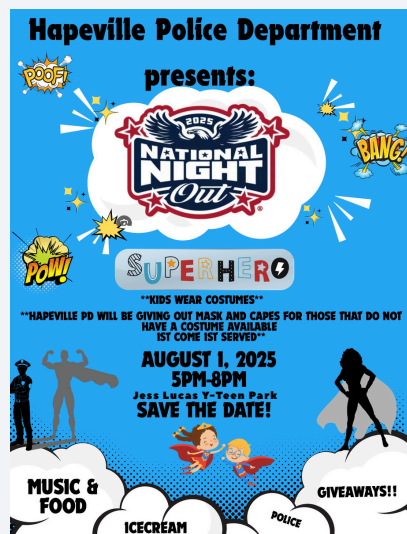

4th of July Safety Tips!

Use fireworks outdoors:

If you are using fireworks, ensure they are used in a clear, open space away from buildings, vehicles, and flammable materials.

Keep a safe distance:

Maintain a safe distance from fireworks while they are being lit and after they have been ignited.

Supervise children:

Never allow children to handle fireworks or sparklers.

Have water nearby:

Keep a bucket of water, a hose, or a fire extinguisher close by in case of emergencies.

Keep pets indoors:

Fireworks can be very stressful for pets, so it's best to keep them indoors during fireworks displays.



♥ New AEDs Installed in Key Park Locations

We're proud to announce that automated external defibrillators (AEDs) have been installed at Jess Lucas Park, John Lewis Park, the ball fields, and the skate park/splash pad.

AEDs are critical, life-saving devices designed to deliver a controlled electric shock to the heart during sudden cardiac arrest. Quick access and use of an AED can dramatically increase survival rates—making these installations an important step in enhancing public safety across our community spaces.

🚗 Safety Reminder: Yield to Vehicles Crossing Train Tracks

As a reminder, please be mindful and yield to vehicles crossing over the train tracks throughout Hapeville. These crossings can become congested, and it's important to allow vehicles the right of way to ensure smooth traffic flow and prevent backups or accidents.
