I. Call to Order

A) Discussion of the Clean and Beautiful Commission

C) Consideration to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Fulton County for animal control services in the the amount of \$7,752.00 and to authorize the Mayor to sign all necessary documents pending legal review.

Summary and Background

Whereas The City of Hapeville has a need to provide animal control service to the residents of the city and provide housing for recovered animals. The city shall enter into an agreement with Fulton County for animal recovery and shelter services and agree to pay the pre determined amount to Fulton County for these services.

MOTION: Alderman Ray made a motion Councilman Lovern seconded a motion to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Fulton County for animal control services in the the amount of \$7,752.00 and to authorize the Mayor to sign all necessary documents pending legal review. Motion carried 4-0.

D) Consideration to enter into agreement between Fulton County and the City of Hapeville and authorize Mayor Hallman to sign all necessary documents related to the CDBG program.

Summary and Background

This agreement is for the Community Development Block Grant program. The City of Hapeville applied for funds to modernize our parks, which included improvements to our tennis courts. The City has been awarded \$ 56, 690.00 to improve the city tennis courts.

MOTION: Councilman Lovern made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion enter into agreement between Fulton County and the City of Hapeville and authorize Mayor Hallman to sign all necessary documents related to the CDBG program. Motion carried 4-0.

E) Consideration to approve the expenditure to Rapid ID for purchase of mobile fingerprinting devices in an amount not to exceed \$21,350.00. Summary and Background

The Police Department received a grant from Georgia Emergency Management Agency to enhance local homeland security through the connection to the states Mobile Biometric Fingerprint Identification System. The funds will be reimbursed through the grant.
