B. Motion to adopt Ordinance 2013-11 Dog Kennel Regulations 1st Reading August 20, 2013

Summary and Background

This Ordinance amends the Hapeville Code of Ordinances to define and provide regulations for dog kennels, including specifying requirements for odor prevention, proper discharge of animal waste disposal, outdoor runs, as well as specifying minimal distance requirements of 150 feet between outdoor runs and any residential use or zone and 100 feet between any kennel buildings and any residential use or zone.

MOTION: Alderman Ray made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion to adopt Ordinance 2013-11. Motion carried 3-0.

C. Motion to adopt Ordinance 2013-12 Dogs; Cleaning Up Litter 1st Reading August 20, 2013

Summary and Background

This Ordinance adds section 8-2-7 to the Hapeville Code of Ordinances to provides that any person having the custody or control of any dog on public private or private property of another shall be responsible for cleaning up any feces of the dog and disposing of such feces in a clean and sanitary manner.

MOTION: Councilman Lovern made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion to adopt Ordinance 2013-12. Motion carried 3-0.

D. Motion to adopt Ordinance 2013-13 Credit Card Payments 1st Reading August 20, 2013

Summary and Background

This Ordinance adds section 17-2-7 to the Hapeville Code of Ordinances authorizing the city finance director, with the approval of the city manager, to establish procedures for acceptance of credit card payments for amounts due the city and the imposition of a convenience fee for the use of a credit card when said fee is permitted by the operating rules and regulations of the credit card issuer.

MOTION: Councilman Lovern made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion to adopt Ordinance 2013-13. Motion carried 3-0.

E. Consideration to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Fulton County for Animal Control Services in an amount of \$8,806.99.

MOTION: Alderman Ray made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Fulton County for Animal Control Services in an amount of \$8,806.99. Motion carried 3-0.

Discussion: Councilman Murray stated that the contracted price had been reduced to about half since the City's Code Enforcement Department took over animal control service

Motion carried 3-0.

12. New Business

A. Consideration to reaffirm 4% COLA provided to retirees in 2008. Summary and Background This affirmation of COLA will allow for the retirees to maintain their retirement benefit as approved in 2008.

MOTION: Councilman Murray made a motion Councilman Lovern seconded a motion to reaffirm the 4% COLA provided to reitrees in 2008. Motion carried 3-0.

B. Consideration to waive water tap fees for Hapeville Charter Middle School Community Garden.

Summary and Background

The water tap fees for a 3/4" line is \$1,500 and a 1" line is \$2,000, this includes a water meter.

MOTION: Councilman Lovern made a motion Alderman Ray seconded a motion to waive water tap fees for Hapeville Charter Middle School Community Garden. Motion carried 3-0.

C. Consideration to approve an agreement between Fulton County and the City of Hapeville for the acceptance of C.D.B.G. funding and authorize the request of bids for this sidewalk improvement project.

Summary and Background

The City of Hapeville was awarded \$ 107,500 in Community Development Block Grant Funds for years 2013 and 2014. These funds will be used for sidewalk improvements on North Avenue between Hope Street and Dogwood Drive. There is no match on this grant.

MOTION: Alderman Ray made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion to approve an agreement between Fulton County and the City of Hapeville for the acceptance of C.D.B.G. funding and authorize the request of bids for this sidewalk improvement project. Motion carried 3-0.

D. Consideration to approve a franchise license application for Level 3 Communications for the placement of aerial and underground telecommunications in Hapeville.

Summary and Background

Level 3 Communications is looking to run aerial and underground fiber from Willingham Drive to 1030 Delta Boulevard. If granted the minimum annual franchise fee to be paid to the City would be \$ 1,250 each quarter.

MOTION: Alderman Ray made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion to approve a franchise license application for Level 3 Communications for the placement of aerial and underground telecommunications in Hapeville. Motion carried 3-0.

E. Consideration to contribute an amount not to exceed \$25,000 to the Hapeville Airport Area Community Improvement District (CID) upon formal establishment of said CID within the City of Hapeville.

Summary and Background

Morsberger Revitalization has proposed the establishment of a Hapeville Airport Area Community Improvement District (CID) to be located on the northern side of the Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport. The goals of this CID include upgrading the area's appearance; economic development; and traffic flow

enhancement. This contribution would be for FY 2013-14 and come from the unappropriated balance of the general fund.

MOTION: Councilman Lovern made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion to contribute an amount not to exceed \$25,000 to the Hapeville Airport Area Community Improvement District (CID) upon formal establishment of said CID within the City of Hapeville. Discussion: Emory Morseberger requested that the amount be increased to \$35,000 and that the investment be made prior to the formation of the CID. Motion carried 3-0.

F. Motion to Adopt Resolution 2013-07, Police Surplus Summary and Background These are items no longer in service with the City.

MOTION: Alderman Ray made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion to adopt Resolution 2013-07 Police Surplus. Motion carried 3-0.

G. Consideration to approve an emergency sewer repair in the amount of \$38,231.51 for RDJE Incorporated pending the review by the City Engineer.

Summary and Background

The sewer line on Springhaven Avenue, which is located behind the InCity Suites, collapsed and needed immediate replacement. The sewage was pumped from Springhaven Avenue to North Avenue while nearly 500 linear feet of concrete pipe was replaced.

MOTION: Councilman Lovern made a motion Alderman Ray seconded a motion to approve an emergency sewer repair in the amount of \$38,231.51 for RDJE Incorporated pending the review by the City Engineer. Discussion: Mayor Hallman inquired about concerns from InCity Suites. Motion carrie 3-0.
