Summary and Background
This Resolution authorizes the City to enter into an intergovermental contract to become a member of the Georgia Interlocal Risk Management Agency (GIRMA).

B. Consideration to enter into an Intergovernmental Contract between the City of Hapeville and the Georgia Interlocal Risk Management Agency for property and casualty insurance.

MOTION: Councilman Lovern made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion to enter into an Intergovernmental Contract between the City of Hapeville and the Georgia Interlocal Risk Management Agency for property and casualty insurance. Motion carried 4-0.

C. Consideration to approve application from Tower Cloud, LLC to install approximately 3,600 feet of fiber optic cable within the City right-of-way. Summary and Background

Tower Cloud, Inc. provides backhaul communications services to wireless communications carriers at certain mobile base stations and cells sites located in Georgia. On September 30, 2013, Tower Cloud filed an application with the City requesting permission to install approximately 3,600 feet of fiber optic cable along South Central Avenue to reach a cellular tower located at 464 Porsche Avenue. Pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 46-5-1(b)(3), the City has 60 calendar days from receipt of the completed application to act on such application.

MOTION: Councilman Valero made a motion Alderman Ray seconded a motion to approve the application from Tower Cloud, LLC to install approximately 3,600 feet of fiber optic cable within the City right-of-way. Motion carried 4-0.

D. Consideration to approve RDJE Inc. in the amount of \$32,211.93 for an emergency sewer line repair on North Avenue between Hope Street and Oakdale Road.

Summary and Background

The 8 inch concrete pipe collapsed in two areas and was in deteriorating in other areas. RDJE pipe burst approximately 420 linear feet of new pipe. Keck & Wood will review invoice.

MOTION: Councilman Murray made a motion Councilman Lovern seconded a motion to approve RDJE Inc. in the amount of \$32,211.93 for an emergency sewer line repair on North Avenue between Hope Street and Oakdale Road. Motion carried 4-0.

E. Motion to adopt Resolution 2013-11 GDOT Lighting Agreement Summary and Background

This Resolution authorizes the City to enter into an intergovermental agreement with the Georgia Department of Transportation regarding the placement of lamp posts on N. Central Avenue. Pursuant to the agreement, the City will provide for the energy, maintenance, operation, and repair of the lighting system.

MOTION: Alderman Ray made a motion Councilman Murray seconded a motion to adopt Resolution 2013-11. Motion carried 4-0.

F. Consideration to enter into a lighting project agreement between the Georgia Department of Transportation and the City of Hapeville.

Summary and Background

This agreement is for the N. Central Avenue Streetscape Project. This agreement allows the City to place new lamp posts on N. Central Avenue, which is a state road. The City will provide the energy, operation and maintenance for this system.

MOTION: Councilman Murray made a motion Councilman Valero seconded a motion to enter into a lighting project agreement between the Georgia Department of Transportation and the City of Hapeville. Motion carried 4-0.
